In 2011, we organized 3 IEEE technical meetings, 3 open seminars lectures and 2 IEEE sessions in corporation with IEICE and IEEJ in the Shin-etsu region in Japan. We supported 5 students in our section through IEEE Shin-etsu young researcher paper award, and 5 students through international conference travel aid.

A.2 Financial Report

Our balance at the end of 2011 was 1,462,644 yen. Income for 2011 totaled 2,301,931 yen. Expenses in 2011 were 839,287 yen, resulting in a balance at the end of 2011 of 1,462,644 yen, which is about US\$18,280 at an exchange rate of 80 yen/\$.
