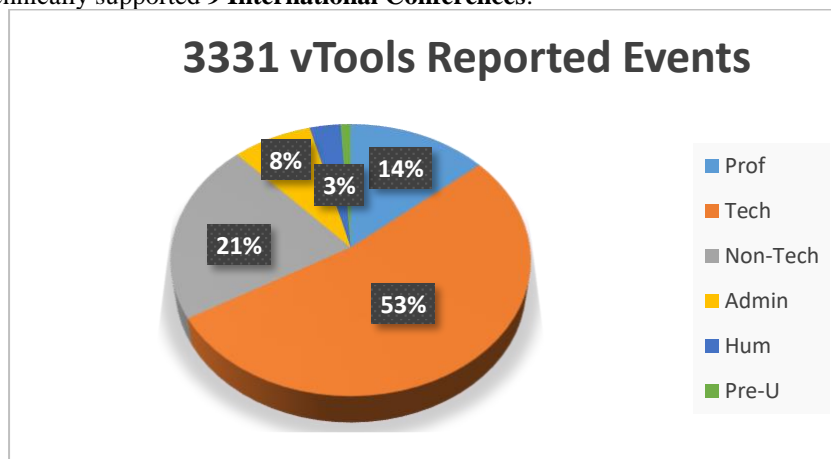

B.3 Professional and Continuing Education Activities

STEM Grant to IEEE Educational Activities Committee

In order to aid section IEEE volunteers in their STEM outreach projects and create local STEM communities, the IEEE Educational Activities Committee has won the prestigious STEM Grant 2022. The joint proposal of IEEE STEM Champion Prof. (Dr.) Santhosh Kumar Gopalan, Chair, IEEE Kerala Section Educational Committee Activities, and Dr. Shailesh S, Assistant Professor, Department of Computer Science, CUSAT, has been funded with a grant of USD 2000. The section was able to train Ninety pre-university teachers in machine learning and artificial intelligence projects through the submission on “*PRE-UNIVERSITY CAPACITY BUILDING WORKSHOP ON ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE*.” Through this training, the teachers were able to comprehend the concepts properly and spread them throughout the schools. Three phases of the program’s execution have included teachers from numerous districts, including Ernakulam, Thrissur, and Alleppey. The 2022 IEEE Pre-University STEM Portal Grants and TryEngineering.org are gratefully acknowledged by the Educational Activities Committee.

- Mentoring of new members and young professionals by appointing senior Section volunteers as advisors

C.6 Problems anticipated and suggestions for solutions, if any

- The major problem that the Section experiences is the retention rate of student members. The transition to GSM/Members is poor.
- The last year has seen a better retention rate of student members due to the efforts of the MD volunteers.
- Internships, within and outside the IEEE communities, and job fairs are ways to retain student members.

PART D - GOALS AND PLANS

D.1 Continuation of project/activity in progress and their implementation plans

- **IEEE Job Fair 2023** jointly with GTECH and MuLearn. 100+ companies are expected to participate. This time we are planning it to conduct at **three locations**, namely, Trivandrum, Kochi and Calicut
- We conducted Job Fair 2022 (ieeejobfair.com) jointly with G TECH, a group Industries at Info Park Kochi in June-July 2022. 5000 Registrations, 500 short listed, 186 offers. One of the most prestigious events of IEEE Kerala Section.

- **EV Hack 3.0** - A national level hackathon in collaboration with **BOSCH**. Third version is upcoming. Students are getting **internship opportunities**.
- **PESGRE 2023**, the 3rd International Conference on Power Electronics, Smart Grid and Renewable Energy at Trivandrum in Dec 2023. Call for Paper submission is in progress.
- **WIECON-ECE, WIE International Conference** on Electrical and Computer Engineering is upcoming in Nov 2023.
- Membership development Activities targeting all Organizational Units (Section, Subsections, Society Chapters, Affinity Group Chapters, Student Branches, Student Branch Chapters and SB Affinity Group Chapters) to get maximum **retention, recruitment and recovery**.
- Membership advancement of eligible professional Members to Senior Members and Fellow grade are also aimed. Nearly **190 Members are elevated** to Senior Members in the last two years.
- For 2023, we are **targeting 50% retention, 10% recovery, 60% recruitment**.
- Expanded the MD Team with Chair, Vice Chair, Secretary, and Representatives from Travancore, Kochi and Malabar areas, YP Team, and MD team of SAC.
- Currently we are working for maximum retention. This will be followed by Recovery & Recruitment from March onwards.

D.3 Any innovative ideas to make IEEE more creative and value-added for sustaining the membership retention and recruitment goals.

- For the last two years, we were closely monitoring the membership growth, Retention, Recovery and Recruitment. We observed that the retention rate is very less in **Member and Student Member category**.
- In 2022, we noted that 533 Student Members and GSMs are elevated to Members in June and August. **Only 44/533** in this category are renewed for 2023. The main reason for the low renewal is the **hike in membership dues from \$ 13.5 to \$86.00 / \$80.5**. The situation was exactly same in 2021 and previous years also.
- We discussed this matter with Dr David Kohler, Vice President MGA in the Section Chairs meet held at Bangalore on 12 Nov 2022. We proposed a new member grade, namely, **“Recent Graduate Member”** in IEEE with membership dues same as that of GSM for three years. A proposal in this regard was given to Mr Deepak Mathur, 2022 R10 Director as suggested by Dr David Kohler in November itself. If this suggestion is approved, the retention among newly elevated Members and recruitment among recently graduated members will be high.

D.4 Business Plan for Sustainable Growth and Financial Stability.

IEEE Kerala Section has been a leader in membership growth and has grown to become the section with largest number of members. We have also been financially disciplined by following of local audit rules in our execution and following IEEE financial guidelines.

To improve ourselves we are setting out the following plan:

- Increase our professional membership by targeting student leaders from society chapters in becoming part of GSM and Young Professionals.
- Elevating members to senior members which has been found to have 90% or more retention as a category.
- Increase professional member interaction to promote involvement and improve retention
- Conduct funding related workshops to educate members on how to apply for IEEE grants
- Follow strict financial discipline and conduct training for all office bearers on how to use funds the right way.
