
B.1 Membership Development Activities

Our membership statistics for January 2023 (IEEE OU Analytics as of 21 January 2023) are shown in the table below.



B.3 Students Activities

IEEE South Australia has three student branches at Adelaide University, Flinders University, and the University of South Australia. In order to encourage more student members, the Section presents an award to a student at each of the three South Australian universities for the best achievement in electrical and electronic courses. The students are nominated by the University, and the awardees receive a certificate and a cash prize. The student award prize-winners for the IEEE South Australia Section 2021 Student Award for Excellence in Engineering with an electrical and/or electronics emphasis are:

These awards will be presented to each of the students at the 2022 SA Section's End of Year dinner. The Student Branches at The University of Adelaide and Flinders University continued their high levels of activity.

This year, the section ran the Australian and New Zealand Student and Young Professional Conference (ANZSCON) which was a massive undertaking.

The event attracted a large number of students (47) and young professionals (15). Many were also women in engineering members and were able to participate in a number of dedicated sessions. The SA section required students to become members in order to receive a complementary ticket, so this greatly increased the number of IEEE members in the section.

There were 8 sponsors at the event who all commented on how well the event was run and were very thankful for the opportunity. Both Deepak Mathur, the R10 director and Emre Ayranci, the YP Global Chair attended and were impressed by the breadth of sessions and the enthusiasm of the attendees.

The program challenged many students to consider their career pathway and to explore aspects of entrepreneurship, how to better network.
