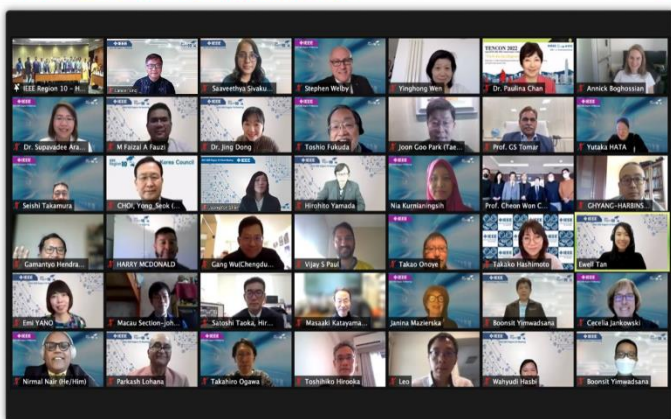
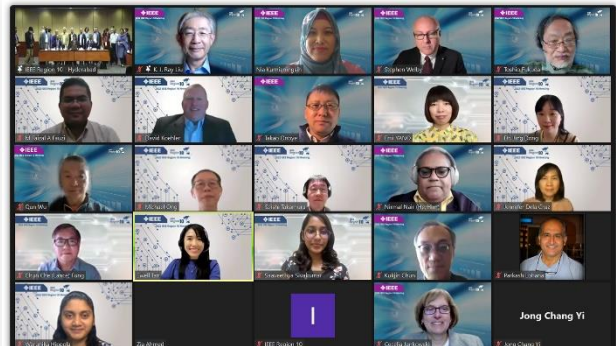


IEEE Region-10 Annual General Meeting (Hybrid) 26-27 February 2022

Minutes of the Meeting

The first ever hybrid Annual General Meeting (AGM) of Region-10 was held on 26-27 February 2022 with **134** participants (28 Executive Committee members, 57 primary delegates and 31 secondary delegates across Region-10 Sections/Councils, 2 Subsection officers, 8 guests, and 8 IEEE staff). A good number of delegates, mainly from India, attended the meeting in-person at Novotel & HICC Complex, Hyderabad, India. Also the delegates from South Korea attended the meeting in person at Jeju and the rest of the people joined virtually via Zoom on both the days. The meeting was conducted smoothly with the support from Region-10 Project Manager Ms. Ewell Tan, the volunteers at Hyderabad, and IEEE India office. A delegate from Australia (ACT Section) and Region 8 Director, Antonio Luque also joined the meeting at Hyderabad.

Day-1 (26 February 2022)

The formal Region-10 meeting started with the roll call of all attendees recorded based on Zoom data and physical marking from the hybrid venues. The attendee list was presented on screen to all participants which was followed by adoption of the agenda of the meeting. Region-10 Director, Mr. Deepak Mathur presented the agenda and it was approved.

Region-10 Director, Deepak Mathur delivered the welcome address. Director welcomed special guests to the meeting. IEEE President & CEO: K J Ray Liu; Executive Director & COO: Stephen Welby, VP MGA: David Koehler; Managing Director MGA: Cecelia Jankowski, other Region Directors attended the meeting: R3: Theresa Brunasso; R5: Bob Becnel ; R8: Antonio Luque, who attended the meeting in person at Hyderabad ; R9: Enrique Tejera; Past President of IEEE Toshio Fukuda, Past MGA VP Kukjin Chun, Region-10 EXCOM members; Region-10 Section/Council/Subsection Delegates; Region-10 Past Director Janina Mazierska, and Chair, MGA Training Committee: Mousmi Chaurasia. Director highlighted the current section statistics, especially mentioning about 60 sections, 43 YP AGs and 48 WIE AGs, 16 LM AGs, 1638 Student branches as well as the Region-10 membership statistics. Followed by this, the Region-10 ExCom members for 2021-22 was introduced. Director presented his kind appreciation for EXCOM members for their dedicated efforts in an exemplary way during the unprecedented challenges of 2021; All Councils, Sections, Subsections and other OUs for their efforts, contributions in engaging members and contributing immensely to the growth of Region-10 and IEEE. Director presented Flagship Events 2021 TENCON (Auckland, New Zealand, Dec 2021 - Online); 2022 TENCON (Hong Kong, Nov 2022); 2021 TENSYP (Jeju, Korea : Aug 2021 - Hybrid); 2022 TENSYP (Mumbai, India : July 2022); 2021 Region-10 Humanitarian Technology Conference (Bangalore, India : Sep 2021 - Hybrid); 2022 Region-10 Humanitarian Technology Conference (Hyderabad, India : Sep 2022); Region-10 SYWL Congress (Scheduled in 2022). He also highlighted the main focus areas under each committee of Region-10, highlighting the Region-10 thrust areas and priorities. Director encouraged Sections and Subsections to participate in Region-10 programs and Incentive Scheme and use Region-10 incentive in training volunteers, member engagements, re-activating inactive Chapters/SB/SB Chapters/AGs, address member retention issue by value added programs and spreading awareness about the

resources of IEEE – in section programs, using social media. Encouraged section volunteers to participate in the incentive scheme. Reported about Region-10 realignment status: Region-10 will be splitted into two zones as the first steps with distinct zone representatives in IEEE Board of Directors. Thanked Ewell Tan for her dedicated service.

Director next requested President and CEO K. J. Ray Liu for his speech

IEEE President K J Ray Liu presented his speech in a video.

He highlighted the Vision and Mission of IEEE and explained his vision for the future of IEEE.

“IEEE is no longer the “Institute of Electrical and Electronic Engineers”. It includes professionals from different disciplines. It is the home of engineers, entrepreneurs, academicians etc. We should focus on making IEEE the home for your entire career by providing skill training, career development, mentoring, peer networking and by providing products and services like publications, standards etc. IEEE should ultimately be your “professional home””.

Question: Rajnish Sharma- What is the rationale behind removing IEEE in its long form?

Answer: Nowadays IEEE is open for not only engineers, there are also a lot of scientists and other professionals and we want to be more inclusive.

Question: Toshio Fakuda- How to increase the membership annually?

Answer: IEEE engages a large audience in its products. We need to engage the members.
