- Professional Activities

Event	Description
Geospatial future in Low Earth Orbit – Private sector developments in Space	Mr. Siddharth Rajhans, a Principal Policy Officer at the United Nations, delivered a lecture on September 15th, 2023 (Engineers Day) regarding advancements in Satellite technologies in Low Earth Orbit (LEO). He discussed the flourishing private sector startup industry in this domain, focusing on Geospatial Data Analytics, Data Monetization, and the intersection of Big Data & the Geospatial Industry. He highlighted collaborations with platforms like VEDAS (Visualisation of Earth Data Observation and Archival System) and how this data was utilized for industry-centric domains, providing avenues for monetization for startups. The lecture also covered the larger context of privatization in the space industry, with emphasis on initiatives by the Indian Government, particularly the Department of Science and Technology and ISRO, to support startups through mentorship, funding, and access to ISRO technologies for scaling up and commercialization. There were 25 participants.
Lecture on International Scientific Cooperation and DST Schemes: Opportunities	Dr. Sanjeev Kumar Varshney, Head of International Scientific Cooperation in the Ministry/Department of Science & Technology, Government of India, conducted a lecture discussing international cooperation and its implementation by the Indian Government. He outlined the objectives of international cooperation, precautions during planning and implementation, and the structure of various international platforms for researchers to engage with. The lecture was comprehensive and informative, featuring an interactive session with questions and answers. There were 106 participants.
